QParents App – Secure online parent portal

We have been lucky enough to become a pilot school for the release of the new QParent Application and website which is to be implemented in Term 1 2015 with our new year 7 and 8 parents. This process will then be filtered through to our other year levels throughout the year.

The QParents Portal is a secure web and mobile application that provides parents of student's access to their child's student information, in one place with one login.

QParents will assist both staff and parents in sharing and responding to information in an efficient and effective way.

It will allow parents to connect instantly with their child's school to access and manage their child's student information including: Attendance and absences details, including the ability let the school know of changes to normal routine, such as when a child is unwell or has to leave early, behaviour details, academic report cards, class timetables, unpaid invoice details and payment history, personal student details, including the

ability to update information such as medical conditions and enrolment details.

Parents will be able to access their child's student information anytime, anywhere securely online through their smart phone, tablet or computer.

QParents won't replace the traditional ways we communicate, however, it will provide another way for parents to communicate with us.

This is a very exciting concept for us as we work towards a higher level of communication with our parents.

Login information and more details will be made available to parents as the trial begins through newsletters and our school website.

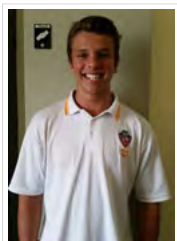

LEGAL EAGLES SOAR AT MIAMI HIGH

Every year Short, Punch and Greatorix, in conjunction with Griffith University, run the Gold Coast Legal Studies Essay Competition. This esteemed competition attracts Year 12 students from schools all over the Gold Coast. As a rule, teachers will select the best two independent research assignments written by their Year 12s in Term 3. In previous years Miami High has been recognised twice, both Danielle Warren and Brittany Paull have been past recipients of the 'Runner Up' prize.

This year, Hayley Swane and Zoe Boxshall were entered into the competition. Hayley wrote her essay on the need for laws to be revised to allow for voluntary euthanasia. Zoe examined the

unicameral system of government in Queensland and asserted that not having two houses of parliament can produce a number of problems.

On October 16 the girls and I attended the presentation at Short, Punch and Greatorix chambers in Bundall. There we met with other contestants, their teachers, academics from Griffith University and partners of the law firm. Both girls were commended on their excellent work.

We were over the moon when Zoe was announced the winner. She received a cheque for \$500, a book voucher from QBD for \$250, a cheque for the school of \$300, an individual trophy for herself and a prestigious trophy to display in our front office for the next 12 months.

But the accolades did not stop there. One of the authors of the "Legal Studies for Queensland" textbook used in our school and in many others across the state, has requested that Zoe's essay be included in their next Year 11 textbook as an exemplar for other students to follow. This is an honour for Zoe and for our school.

Congratulations to both Zoe and Hayley for not only doing so well in the competition, but for also achieving outstanding results in their final semester of Legal Studies. They are a true testament to what students here at Miami High can achieve when they work hard. Well done girls!



YEAR 10s AND BOND UNIVERSITY EXCURSION

The Year 10 Legal Studies class has also had a great opportunity in recent weeks. They attended the Bond University Court Discovery Day. This was a mock trial scenario put on by law graduates now undertaking their final legal practice course. Students observed the protocols of a court case, were given detailed commentary regarding the processes and saw first-hand the different roles played by courtroom personnel. They also received a tour of the university and a number decided on the spot, that Bond University was for them – excellent, I'll look forward to seeing you all work really hard in Year 11 and 12 to make that a reality.

ANIMAL WELFARE LAWS AT BOND UNIVERSITY

On the night of November 6 a number of Legal Studies students also made the effort to attend a fascinating debate/lecture on the topic of Animal Welfare Laws. The debate was conducted by law students and judged by the highly respected Justice Michael Kirby formerly of the High Court. Several Year 12s and one Year 10 were enthralled by the subject matter. How inspiring to see a group of young people so excited by ideas and intellectual debate. Congratulations to those students who took it upon themselves to come along – I hope you enjoyed the evening as much as I did.

Both groups performed in Act 2 of the show with a rousing applause. The evening finished with a combined schools Finale which filled the theatre with over 340 secondary dance students.

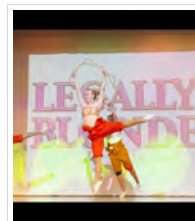
