

This course is perfect for people looking to gain a broad overview of the healthcare system as well as knowledge unique to allied health specialities. The sector is undergoing strong job growth in Australia with more than 50,000 jobs expected to open in the next five years.

The Certificate II in Health Support Services will give you the foundation skills necessary to work in an assistant role within a health care facility equipping you to work with people from diverse backgrounds and comply with infection prevention, policies and procedures.

The Certificate IV in Allied Health Assistance is designed to equip students with the practical skills and knowledge required to support Allied Health Professionals in a diverse range of healthcare settings. Students will learn to assist with clinical assessments, implement individual care plans, monitor patient progress, and provide direct support to clients under supervision in their work placement.

Upon completion, graduates are qualified to work as an allied health assistant in hospitals, clinics, and other healthcare environments, making valuable contributions to the health and well-being of patients.

Entry requirements

Students must have achieved a C or higher in Year 10 English. At enrolment students will need to provide their Unique Student Identifier (<u>usi.gov.au</u>) and complete an LLN test to determine suitability and any support needs.

Duration and location

This is an 18 month course delivered in years 11 & 12 on site with qualified TESS trainers via a third party arrangement with GeSS Education.

Fees

The total Fee for Service cost is VETiS + \$950 (Payment Plan Available – Deposit \$200, 3 x \$250/month
